Contributions to Scott Rigell for Congress are not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes. Federal election law requires political committees to use best efforts to report the name, mailing address, occupation, and name of employer of individuals whose contributions exceed \$200 during an election cycle. Funds received in response to this solicitation are subject to federal contribution limits. Individuals may contribute up to \$4,800 per election cycle to Scott Rigell for Congress (\$2,400 for the Primary election and \$2,400 for the General election). Federal law prohibits contributions for the general treasury funds of corporations, labor organizations or national banks. Contributions from Federal government contractors and foreign nationals who lack permanent resident status are also prohibited. Contributions must be drawn on personal, not corporate, credit cards.
